Best known for her obsessive accumulations of household plastics in the same hue (a kiddie pool overflowing with blue items fills one room here), Munson also makes photographs of floral still-lives using her studio scanner and materials found in her garden upstate. Flowers, bulbs, and petals form radiating patterns around animal specimens (a bat, an owl, a fox), in works that recall both Victorian memorials and Indian mandalas. Munson's work is sweetly unpretentious and has a seductive luminosity; each floral element appears to emit light, like a homespun Tiffany lampshade. Through May 4.
